

KPNA Meeting Minutes: November 8, 2011

1. Proposal of Zoning Changes

Imagine Kutzky (IK) submitted an important zoning document tonight worthy of your review (Will be sent in additional e-mail due to space). This document that will affect you as a homeowner should you remodel, reconstruct, and could even affect your ability to sell since new homebuyers would need to comply to the proposed changes. Open neighborhood forum and discussion will occur in 3 weeks; your feedback on Tuesday, November 29 at Lourdes HS at 7 p.m. is vital in the further development of this document.
